WEDNESDAY - October 7th, 14th, 21st, November 4th, 18th, December 2nd, 9th, 16th

GIRLS LEADERSHIP GRADES: 4-6 FEE: \$90.00

As girls enter adolescence, they are more reluctant to assert themselves and take credit for their accomplishments. Promoting leadership is about nurturing self-confidence. This workshop gives girls the opportunity to develop skills such as goal setting, time management, organization, decision making and problem solving, assertiveness, positive self-talk, public speaking, and stress management.
